Our Vision

The Guardian Scholars Foundation is a scholarship and mentorship program that leverages the expertise and resources of both the public and private sector to create a synergy of support for youth who have spent time in the Iowa foster care system between the ages of 14 and 18 or in other similar situations.

Together, a network of academic institutions, community organizations, public service agencies, and private citizens create a community dedicated to assisting foster youth in achieving their educational goals.

What We Provide

Up to \$8,000 in scholarship funds per year to fill gaps in state/federal funds and school scholarships, with the goal to achieve:

- Paid academic tuition
- Free academic year room and board
- Stipend for textbooks

An adult community mentor who may arrange tutors, holiday stays, give career advice and supply other needs is also arranged for each student.

Why We're Passionate

Approximately 4,500 children entering the foster care system each year in Iowa alone.

Only 58% of foster youth graduate high school as compared to 87% nationally.

When a foster youth ages out of the system without graduating high school, it is projected that each individual will cost taxpayers \$300,000 in costs absorbed by the community over their lifetime.

Of the young adults aging out of foster care fewer than 3% will earn a college degree by age 25 (compared to 28% of all 25 years olds).

One in four of foster youth will be involved in the justice system within two years of leaving the foster care system. More than one in five will become homeless after age 18.

71% of foster women are pregnant by 21, facing higher rates of unemployment, criminal conviction, public assistance, and involvement in the child welfare system.

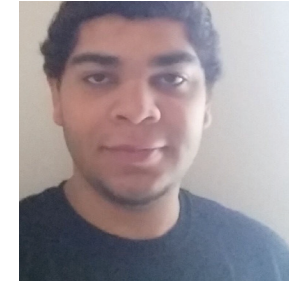


ALEXANDER, SIMPSON COLLEGE
